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
## **Beck Shows Signs of Vulnerability Poll Results**

A July survey in the race for state Senate in New Jersey's 11<sup>th</sup> Legislative District shows incumbent Republican Senator Jennifer Beck in a weak position against Democratic challenger Vin Gopal.<sup>1</sup> Though she starts the race leading, 41 percent – 52 percent, Gopal's compelling profile and Beck's vulnerabilities draw the race to a virtual tie by the end of the survey, 45 percent to 43 percent. Partisan measures including the generic ballot (46 percent Democratic – 43 percent Republican) and self-identified partisanship (45 percent Democratic – 43 percent Republican) also point to a competitive race in a district Hillary Clinton won by 7 points. Governor Chris Christie's job approval rating has the potential to drag down Beck; just 16 percent of voters rate his performance as excellent or good.

Though the election is still a ways off, Beck's vulnerabilities in a district that no longer tilts Republican put her seat in jeopardy in November.
