

Executive Summary

Gravis Marketing, a nonpartisan research firm, conducted a random survey of 563 likely voters across New Jersey. The poll was conducted from July 6^{th} through the 10^{th} and has a margin of error of $\pm 4.1\%$. The totals may not round to 100% because of rounding. The survey was conducted using an online panel of cell phone users and interactive voice responses. The results are weighted by voting demographics. The poll was paid for by Gravis Marketing.




















