Dear Ms. Leopold:

I am writing in regards to Robert J. Hugin, a former employee and managing director at J.P. Morgan Chase from 1984 to 1999.

As you may know, Mr. Hugin is the Republican nominee for the United States Senate for New Jersey. Despite inquiries from the press and general public, Mr. Hugin has refused to discuss his tenure at J.P. Morgan in any detail. The extent of the public's knowledge of Mr. Hugin's work at the company is limited to the fact that he was managing director of the syndicate desk before he departed in April 1999. Mr. Hugin has refused to provide his consent to release pertinent records - including the U5 form that must be filed with the Financial Industry Regulatory Authority - despite his ability to do so.

Due to Mr. Hugin's pursuit of high federal office, the facts surrounding Mr. Hugin's leadership role at a large financial institution are a matter of pressing public concern and public interest. As such, I respectfully request that J.P. Morgan release all relevant correspondence, information, and any and all forms filed within your organization, and with FINRA and the Securities and Exchange Commission, in regards to Mr. Hugin's tenure and sudden departure from J.P. Morgan.

Thank you for your cooperation in providing the materials concerning Mr. Hugin's employment at your firm.
