Total Spending on Legislative Election Now Above \$27 Million

Spending by legislative candidates and independent expenditure-only filers has sailed past \$27 million with the November 4 election looming Tuesday, according to disclosure reports filed with the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission (ELEC).

More than \$22.4 million of that total- 83 percent- has been targeted on just ten of the state's 40 legislative districts.

The 8th Legislative District is one of only two in the state with one Democratic and one Republican Assembly member. In a year when Democrats are trying to maintain a 52 to 28 seat majority, it has drawn the most spending- \$4.6 million.

It is already one of the top ten most expensive campaigns in years with just the 80-member State

Assembly on the ballot. Republican candidates and independent expenditure-only filers have spent more than

Democrats in the district, which includes parts of Atlantic and Burlington County.

Six other legislative districts - 21, 11, 16, 38, 3, and 4 - each have attracted more than \$2 million in spending. Generally, legislative districts with the heaviest spending tend to be the ones the two major parties hope to retain or shift in their favor.

Democrats, who have controlled the lower house since 2002, have raised nearly three times more funds, spent more than twice as much and reported four times more cash reserves heading into the election's final days.

Incumbents of both parties enjoy a huge financial edge in the election. They have five times as much as challengers, spent almost four times as much and have nine times more cash in their campaign bank accounts.

Most of the reported campaign activity in this analysis reflected spending that occurred between October 4 and October 21. Some reported activity by independent expenditure-only committees came from 72/24 reports due after October 22 from candidates and independent expenditure-only committees organized as continuing political committees. Some independent expenditure committees not required to file 72/24 reports did so voluntarily.
